

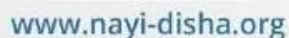
You cannot edit the profile once it has gone to print. You have to surrender the UDID card stating the reason for surrender and you have to generate the card again.

If you lose your UDID application receipt, you can still track your application or find your Enrollment/UDID number on the Unique Disability ID Portal (<https://swavlambancard.gov.in/track-your-application>) using your registered mobile number, Aadhaar number, or enrollment details. If you don't have access to your old mobile number or Aadhaar details, you can contact the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (DEPwD) for help.

Yes, even if you do not have a disability certificate, you can apply for UDID.

If your UDID card is permanent i.e. if 'P' is written on the top of the card, then you do not need to renew your card. However, if your card is temporary, that is, if it has 'T' written on it, then you need to renew your card. Your hospital will mention after how many years your card needs to be renewed. Please Note: You have to visit the same hospital for UDID renewal.

Go to www.swavlambancard.gov.in, click on "Apply for Renewal of Disability Certificate". Fill the details and submit the form for renewal.

What is UDID Card? A Quick Guide



Unique Disability Identity Document (UDID) is a sort of Identity Card for those who have any kind of disability (Persons With Disability).

The UDID card is also known as the Swavalamban card. With the objective of creating a unified system for issuing Universal ID and Disability Certificate, the UDID project has been initiated by the Department of Empowerment and Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities.

Process of applying for UDID Card

The process and procedure to apply for a Unique Disability Identification

Document (UDID) can be done with the Swavalamban website. The steps to register for UDID are as under:

1. To apply for the UDID card and disability card, visit the website <https://swavlambancard.gov.in/>.
2. On the webpage, click on "Apply for UDID" to apply for a new UDID application.
3. Fill in all the relevant details like personal, disability, employment, and identity-related information in the application form
4. Upload all the required documents (original Aadhaar card, passport-size picture, signature or thumb impression, etc.). The UDID is applied through a government website, and all information shared there is safe and secure.
5. After the completion of registration process, you will receive an email mentioning your enrollment number on the email ID and contact number provided by you in the form above. (Please download and save the receipt.) The receipt will contain the child's UDID enrolment number and the names of government hospitals available in the vicinity, where you can take your child for evaluation.)



CP often causes locomotor challenges, but listing it only as locomotor disability misses its full impact. UDID misclassification can block access to CP-specific schemes, therapies, and National Trust support.

Documents required: The applicant need to have with them a photo or scanned copy of the following documents:

- Original Aadhaar Card (If the permanent address is different from the correspondence address, document for permanent address will be required.)
- Passport size photo
- Signature or thumb impression (Please take the image on a blank white paper.)
- Original disability certificate (if applicable)
- Income certificate (optional)

Steps after registration

1. As soon as your registration will get completed, you will receive a message on your registered phone number and email ID.
2. You can download the receipt of submitted application form from <https://swavlambancard.gov.in> - the Swavalambancard website.
3. You can go to the hospital (or the nearest hospital mentioned with the received acknowledgement copy electronically), show the acknowledgement there, and get an evaluation done for the said purpose.
4. Once the assessment and verification is done, your UDID card will be sent for paper printing.
5. With the help of the enrollment number on your acknowledgement copy/ the registered mobile number/ the Aadhar card number, one can track the status of the UDID card on the website: <https://swavlambancard.gov.in>
6. After the UDID card is created electronically, the concerned person can download their e-disability card and e-UDID card physically too.

Once the UDID card is made, you cannot make any changes into it.



FAQ (Frequently asked questions)

I have a Disability Certificate, why do I need UDID?

Disability certificate is issued state wise and UDID card is issued online through Swavalamban card website and is applicable across the country.

What is the expected time to get a physical copy of UDID?

It takes about a month for the UDID to be generated.

How do I get the UDID?

You can download the soft copy of UDID from the website www.swavlambancard.gov.in. The physical copy will be sent to the correspondence address mentioned on the Aadhaar card.

My child is unable to provide fingerprints or iris scans during Aadhaar enrolment, how can Aadhaar still be issued for UDID?

If fingerprints or iris scans can't be given for Aadhaar, UIDAI has a Biometric Exception process. In such cases, you must complete 'exceptional enrolment' at an Aadhaar Seva Kendra.
